- 1 Thessalonians 4:13-17 (logistical teaching on harpazo)
- 1 Corinthians 15:51-52 (mystery of one generation not dying)
- John 14:1-3 (intimacy of a future regathering by Jesus to His home)
- Matthew 24; Mark 13; Luke 21 (2-3 days before His death)
- Luke 19:11-27 Parable of the Ten Minas (6 days before His death)
- Luke 17:20-37 Kingdom suddenness (about 2 weeks before His death)
- Luke 12:35-48 Parables on watching and readiness of unknown time (these parables were about 5 months before crucifixion)

³⁵ "Stay dressed for action and keep your <u>lamps burning</u>,

"THIEF" LANGUAGE IS FOR WHO? FAITHFUL AND WISE MANAGER

Matt. 24:43 But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night <u>the thief was coming</u>, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into.

Lk. 12:39 But know this, that if the master of the house had known at what hour <u>the thief was coming</u>, he would not have left his house to be broken into.

1 Thess. 5:2 For you yourselves are fully aware that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night.

1 Thess. 5:4 But you are not in darkness, brothers, for that day to surprise you like a thief.

2 Pet. 3:10 <u>But the day of the Lord will come like a thief</u>, and then the heavens will pass away with a roar, and the heavenly bodies will be burned up and dissolved, and the earth and the works that are done on it will be exposed.

Rev. 3:3 Remember, then, what you received and heard. Keep it, and repent. If you <u>will not wake up, I will come like a thief</u>, and you will not know at what hour I will come against you.

Rev. 16:15 ("Behold, <u>I am coming like a thief</u>! Blessed is the one who stays awake, keeping his garments on, that he may not go about naked and be seen exposed!")

THE MINI ESCHATOLOGY SERMON (LUKE 17:22-37)

Why is this important in understanding the Olivet Discourse?

- About 2 weeks before
- The disciples were known NOT TO UNDERSTAND, especially in the gospel of Luke (2:50; 9:45; 18:34). Anyone ever feel this way?
- Jesus introduces several themes here that He brings up 2 weeks later in the Olivet Discourse ("days of Noah", "one taken and one left").
- This sermon has unique features only to Luke:
 - "days of Lot"
 - "days of the Son of Man" (plural)
 - "remember Lot's wife"
 - "buying and selling and planting and building"

PREFACE concerning the days of the Son of Man (17:20-25)

²⁰ Being asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, he answered them, "The kingdom of God is not coming in ways that can be observed,

²¹ nor will they say, 'Look, here it is!' or 'There!' for behold, the kingdom of God is in the midst of you."

²² And He said to the disciples, "The days are coming when you will desire to see one of the days of the Son of Man, and you will not see it.

²³ And they will say to you, 'Look, there!' or 'Look, here!' Do not go out or follow them.

²⁴ For as the lightning flashes and lights up the sky from one side to the other, so will the Son of Man be in his day.

²⁵ But first he must suffer many things and be rejected by this generation.

- Jesus Himself is the essence of the kingdom. Where He is, the kingdom is.
- The kingdom's arrival is also at a future time. The disciples will not see it, but long for it.
- Jesus will return on a specific day like lightning. Unmistakable.
- The return of Jesus language inherently involves DAYS (length of time, not just one day)

PATTERN concerning the days of the Son of Man (17:26-30)

²⁶ Just as it was in the days of Noah, so will it be in the days of the Son of Man.

²⁷ They were eating and drinking and marrying and being given in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and the flood came and destroyed them all.

²⁸ Likewise, just as it was in the days of Lot-- they were eating and drinking, buying and selling, planting and building,
 ²⁹ but on the day when Lot went out from Sodom, fire and sulfur rained from heaven and destroyed them all- ³⁰ according to this pattern it will be on the day when the Son of Man is revealed.

- Jesus makes a specific comparison between the DAYS of Noah and Lot with His own coming. "Just as" "Likewise" "according to this pattern" *kata ta auta* (plural)- Luke 6:23, 26
- The pattern of the days of Noah and Lot include the entire scope of time from the short time period before the judgment came up until the fulfillment of the judgment.
- In the same way, the days of the Son of Man will include the whole scope.
- Casual, normal, unaware living followed by sudden unexpected judgment.

PATTERN concerning the days of the Son of Man (17:26-30)

OBJECTION- Parables only have one point

"However, in support of the major point, <u>some details</u> in the parables are analogous to certain spiritual facts. <u>Sometimes</u> this is necessary for the major point of the parable to be fully drawn. In the Parable of the Lost Sheep, the shepherd obviously represents Jesus, the 1 sheep represents a lost sinner, as Jesus explained in Luke 15:7, and the remaining 99 sheep represent "righteous persons who do not need to repent." And yet other details such as the open country, the shepherd's shoulders, and his home and friends and neighbors should not be made analogous to some spiritual elements. They simply are parts needed to make the story lifelike and to add local color...<u>Sometimes Jesus did explain a number of the details of a parable</u>, as in the Parable of the Sower in which He explained the meaning of each of the four places where the seed fell (Matt. 13:18–23; Mark 4:13). He also interpreted <u>several details</u> in the Parable of the Weeds, including the sower, the field, the good seed, the weeds, the enemy, the harvest, and the harvesters (vv. 37–39). Since Jesus did not normally point out analogies in all parts of His parables, these examples in Matthew 13 should be seen as exceptions" (page 215-216- my emphasis).

PERSPECTIVE concerning the days of the Son of Man (17:31-33)

³¹ On that day, let the one who is on the housetop, with his goods in the house, not come down to take them away, and likewise let the one who is in the field not turn back.

³² Remember Lot's wife.

³³ Whoever seeks to preserve his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life will keep it.

- Jesus makes the point of being SINGLE MINDED when it comes to being ready.
- Do not get caught up only in the normal activities of life.
- Be a true disciple who loses their life for the sake of the gospel.

PAYOFF concerning the days of the Son of Man (17:34-37)

³⁴ I tell you, in that night there will be two in one bed. One will be taken and the other left.

- ³⁵ There will be two women grinding together. One will be taken and the other left."
- ³⁶ *Two men will be in the field; one will be taken and the other will be left.* (oldest Greek manuscripts do not have this)
- ³⁷ And they said to him, "Where, Lord?" He said to them, "Where the corpse is, there the vultures will gather."
- Jesus describes the days of the Son of Man will involve separation.
- The separation will involve some in bed, some grinding, others in the field (Matt 24:40)

Are the righteous TAKEN or LEFT?REMEMBER LOT'S WIFE (and Noah)

- Noah clearly taken (rescued) to safety, the rest were left to judgment of flood
- Lot and his daughters were clearly taken (rescued) to safety; the rest were left to judgment
- What about verse 37? Behold, your house is left to you desolate (Luke 13:35)

SUMMARY OF LUKE 17:20-37

- Days of the Son of Man follow the pattern of the days of Noah and Lot
 - Involves a description of the period of time before a sudden judgment
 - Includes a RESCUE before the judgment upon a CASUAL world
 - The believers are <u>taken</u> to salvation. The unbelievers are <u>left</u> to judgment.
 - The days of the Son of Man entail the time from the RESCUE up through the 7-year tribulation judgment and Jesus' return in great glory at the 2nd coming
 - The "day of the Lord" is often synonymous with the "days of the Son of Man"

OUTLINE HARMONY OF THE OLIVET DISCOURSE

- 1. Questions about Jerusalem destruction, the sign of end of the age and His coming.
- 2. Jesus explains there will always be deceit and rumors of war. End is not yet.
- 3. Jerusalem will be surrounded and destroyed, leading the Jews into captivity.
- 4. Before the end of the age, the apostles themselves will suffer persecution.
- 5. Signs of the end of the age include war, famine, pestilence, earthquakes, astronomical disturbances and persecution of believers.
- 6. Abomination of desolation and extreme unprecedented tribulation worldwide.
- 7. After the tribulation, more cosmic signs and the sign of the <u>Son of Man's return!</u>
- 8. Parable of the Fig Tree in all THREE synoptics (Great consistency)
- 9. That generation will not pass away. The words of Jesus will never pass away.

"THAT DAY AND HOUR"

Based on context and harmony of the Olivet Discourse:

- "That day and hour" refers to the DAY OF THE LORD in its entirety
- "That day" (and hour) comes upon the whole world suddenly as a trap
- "That day" (and hour) can be avoided by being watchful and escaping ALL the things that are contained in it.
- All these things, Jesus just explained in the previous sections of the O.D.

² For you yourselves are fully aware that the **day of the Lord** will come like a thief in the night.

³ While people are saying, "There is peace and security," then <u>sudden destruction</u> will come upon them as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and they <u>will not escape</u>.

⁴ But you are not in darkness, brothers, for <u>that day to surprise you like a thief</u>. (1 Thess. 5:2-4)

¹⁰ Because you have kept my word about patient endurance, I will <u>keep you</u> from <u>the **hour** of trial</u> that is coming on the <u>whole world</u>, to try those who dwell on the earth. (Rev. 3:10)

The Days of the Son of Man (Matthew 24:36-45)

³⁶ "But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only.

³⁷ For as were the <u>days</u> of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man.

³⁸ For as in those <u>days before the flood</u> they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark,

³⁹ and they were **unaware** until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man.

⁴⁰ <u>**Then**</u> (*Tóte*) two men will be in the field; one will be <u>taken</u> and one left.

(*Τότε* is a temporal adverb)

⁴¹ Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be <u>taken</u> and one left.

⁴² Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming.

⁴³ But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the <u>thief</u> was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into.

⁴⁴ Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.

- The arrival of THAT DAY AND HOUR is unknown but will happen suddenly on the unaware
- That DAY and HOUR will arrive with judgment. A rescue will occur where the righteous will be taken to salvation and the rest will be left for the judgment of that great day.

The Days of the Son of Man (Matthew 24:36-45)

OBJECTION- <u>Taken</u> in the gospel of Matthew means to judgment

- The Greek word *sullego* ("gathered/taken") are in a negative context
- Matthew 13:28, 29, 30, 40, 41 are negative
- Matthew 13:48 is positive

Matthew 13:48 When it was full, men drew it ashore and sat down and <u>gathered</u> the <u>good</u> into containers but threw away the bad.

Additionally, Matthew uses a synonymous Greek word (*episunago*) in showing that the angels are gathering the elect after the tribulation (24:31).

You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect (Lk 12:40).

Revelation 6-18 "living"

Olivet Discourse "living"

War, massive inflation (2 loaves of bread costing a full day's wage), One-fourth of world killed by sword, hunger, disease, martyrdom, great earthquakes, cosmic astronomical disturbances, One-third of earth burned up, sea turned to blood, sea creatures, ships destroyed, wormwood, more cosmic disturbances in sun, moon, stars, 5 months of demon locust plague where people seek death, 200 million demons killing 1/3 of humanity, painful sores on those with mark of the beast, all sea creatures die, rivers and springs turn to blood, sun scorches mankind, periods of darkness, greatest earthquake in history, 75 lb. hailstones, cursing God.

Birth pains which increase in frequency and intensity. These include great earthquakes in various places, famines, pestilences, fearful sights and great signs from heaven, nation against nation, kingdom against kingdom, tribulation, betrayal by family, hating of one another, false prophets and deception, love of many growing cold, people fainting from fear, Jews fleeing into the mountains to hide from the antichrist, greatest time of tribulation in the history of the world, it is so bad that if God did not limit the time period of Great Tribulation, all humanity would be eliminated, great signs and wonders to deceive, final war before Jesus returns.

The Day & Hour "living"

Matthew 24:37-39

Noah's Day— *"In the <u>days</u> before the flood"* - unaware (oblivious), eating, drinking, marrying, giving in marriage

Luke 17:26-27

Noah's Day eating, drinking, marrying, giving in marriage

Luke 17:28-29

Lot's Day eating, drinking, buying, selling, planting, building
